Helpful Hints for Effective Instruction: Structures

- Keep eye contact-try to avoid writing on the board, charts and talking at the same time
- · Preferential seating
- Use visuals as much as possible: handouts, outlines




Helpful Hints for Effective Instruction: Learning

- Ask "tell me what you know" rather than"Do you understand" (avoid yes/no questions)
- Explicit teaching of new vocabulary
- Identify the topic, repeat questions asked and summarize whenever possible.
